Today...

Worship Leadership and Support... We are short-staffed in the area of lay Eucharistic Ministers. The requirements are to be at least 16 years old and confirmed. You also need to undergo training in liturgy and in policy. Speak to one of the clergy if you have interest in helping our worship community as a communion and worship assistant.

Sacramental Photography Study Class... Reese Riley will lead an exploration of the Sacraments and the sacramental rites of the church through the lens of photography. Over five weeks, he will share photos he has taken that give evidence of the sacramental quality of life and which reveal new insights into the Sacraments of the Church. Participants will also have assignments to bring in pictures or photographs. There will be two opportunities to participate in the class: Sundays in August, beginning August 1, at 11:00 am, and Thursdays, beginning August 5, at 10:30 am. Come refresh your vision of the Holy.

Sunday Supper Program on August 1... Everyone is welcome to enjoy a Sunday Supper at St. Paul's Church at 5:30 pm on the first Sunday of the month, August 1. This outreach program, providing a free home-cooked meal to any who are hungry, is an outgrowth of the Angel Food ministry. There were 70 guests for the July 4 BBQ! Help us spread the word. Tell your friends and distribute some flyers. If you are able to help, especially on the clean-up crew, call Laura Siriani.

You can help stock our Sunday Supper pantry!... So far, we have been surprised by how much food we could prepare from the AngelFood surplus and donations from individuals. This is not a program that is part of the operational budget of the church. Cash donations we have received are a good back-up, but we suddenly are serving 70 guests and expect that number to grow. YOUR food donations can help "stretch the soup." to feed more of our neighbors. **The Sunday Supper Donation Box** will be in front of the church each Saturday and Sunday. Items we can use are: Rolls

or bread that can be frozen; Desserts that can be frozen; Large cans of tomato sauce or crushed tomatoes; Large containers of juice; Large cans of beans (any kind); Cooking oil; Salad dressings; Spices (oregano, garlic salt, dried basil, salt, pepper; Paper plates and bowls. And for guests to take home: Travel soaps, shampoos, snack bars, canned meals with pull top openers.
